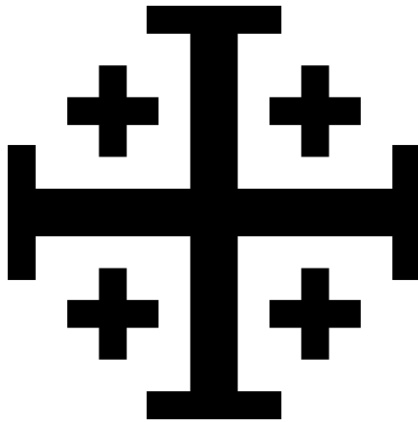

Modernised Edition

This is a modernised edition of the Morning and Evening Prayer services, commonly called the Daily Office, which are found in the 1662 *Book of Common Prayer* of the Church of England. Great care has been taken to ensure that the exact meaning of the original contents has been preserved while also making the language more accessible for a modern and/or younger audience. The rubrics (instructions) have also been completely re-written to clarify their meaning. Notes:

- Sections that are in [brackets] may only be suitable for when there are multiple participants and can be omitted if one is praying alone.
- If one is praying alone, they should say the parts that are designated for both the **Leader** and for **All**.
- The section designated for a **Priest Only** should only be said by one who is ordained as a Presbyter, if there is no Presbyter present then this section should be omitted.
- If there are multiple participants, sections designated by a star (★) can either be said by all present or individuals may be appointed to say them.
- The three readings from Scripture (from the Psalms, Old Testament and New Testament) can either be read by all present or by an appointed person.
- The Gloria (glory be to the Father, and to the Son... etc.) should always be said by all present.
- Near the end of the service it is instructed that the Collect appointed for today should be said, these Collects can be found elsewhere.
- Near the end of the service are two prayers that are said for the Monarch and Royal Family of Britain, an alternative version exclusive to this booklet has been written for each of these and are found below the original, for one's national leader and the company of senators/governors of their nation respectively.
- *N* should be replaced with the Name of the leader of one's nation.

Morning Prayer

One or more of these sentences is read.

When the wicked man turns away from the wickedness that he has committed, and does that which is lawful and right, he shall save his soul and live. *Ezekiel 18:27*

I acknowledge my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. *Psalms 51:3*

Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquities. *Psalms 51:9*

Our sacrifice to God is a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, you will not despise. *Psalms 51:17*

Tear your heart, and not your clothes, and turn to the Lord your God: for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and of great kindness, and turn to him from your evil ways. *Joel 2:13*

The Lord our God has mercy and forgiveness, even though we have rebelled against him, and even though we have not obeyed the voice of the Lord our God or followed the laws which he set before us. *Daniel 9:9-10*

O Lord, correct me, but with righteousness, not in anger, otherwise you will bring me to nothing. *Jeremiah 10:24; Psalms 6:1*

Repent, for the Kingdom of heaven is at hand. *Matthew 3:2*

I will rise up and go to my father, and will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven, and before you, and am no longer worthy to be called your son." *Luke 15:18-19*

If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us: but if we confess our sins, he is faithful

and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. *1 John 1:8-9*

[Leader: Dearly beloved brethren, Scripture tells us in many places, to acknowledge and confess our wickedness and numerous sins; and says that we should not conceal or hide them from the face of Almighty God our heavenly Father; but confess them with a humble, lowly, penitent, and obedient heart; so that we may obtain forgiveness of them, by his infinite goodness and mercy. And although we must, at all times, humbly acknowledge our sins before God; we ought especially to do so when we assemble and meet together to express thanks for the great benefits that we have received at God's hands, to give him most worthy praise, to hear his most holy Word, and to ask for all things that are needed and necessary, for the body as well as the soul. Therefore I ask and encourage all you who are present, to accompany me with a pure heart, humbly looking to the throne of the heavenly grace, and saying after me:]

All: Almighty and most merciful Father; we have failed and wandered from your ways like lost sheep. We have followed too much the lusts and impulses of our own hearts. We have offended you, and disobeyed your holy laws. We have left undone those things which we should have done. And we have done those things which we should not have done. And there is no health in our hearts. But you, O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable sinners. Spare those, O God, who confess their faults. Restore those who are repentant, because of the promises you declared to mankind in Christ Jesus our Lord. And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, that we may from now on live a godly, righteous, and sober life, to the glory of your holy Name. Amen.

If an ordained Priest is present, they may say this Absolution:

[Priest Only: Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who never desires the death of a sinner, but always that they may turn from their wickedness, and live; and has empowered and commanded his Ministers to declare and pronounce to his people that are repentant, the Absolution and Remission of their sins: He forgives and absolves all those who truly repent, and steadfastly believe his holy Gospel. Therefore let us ask him to grant us true repentance, and his Holy Spirit, so that all we do may please him and that the rest of our lives may be pure and holy; so that at the last day we may come to his eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord.]

All: Our Father, who is in heaven, hallowed be your Name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For yours is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Leader. O Lord, open our lips.

All. And our mouth shall declare your praise.

Leader. O God, come quickly to save us.

All. O Lord, come swiftly to help us.

Leader. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

All. As it was in the beginning, is now, and shall be forever. Amen.

Leader. Praise the Lord.

All. The Lord's Name be praised.

Venite, Exultemus Domino (Psalm 95)

☆: O come, let us sing to the Lord,

You are the everlasting Son, of the Father.

When you endeavored to deliver man, you humbly accepted the Virgin's womb.

We believe that you will come, to be our Judge.

Benedictus (Luke 1:68-79)

☆: Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has visited and
redeemed his people;
And has raised up a mighty saviour for us, in the house of
his servant David;
As he promised by the words of his holy Prophets, who have
said since the world began,
that we will be saved from our enemies, and from the hand
of all who hate us.
That he will accomplish the mercy promised to our
ancestors, and remember his holy Covenant;
That he will fulfill the oath which he swore to our forefather
Abraham, for our sake.
That we will be delivered out of the hand of our enemies, so
that we may serve him without fear,
in holiness and righteousness before him, all the days of our
life.
And you, child, will be called the Prophet of the Highest,
for you will go before the face of the Lord to prepare his
ways.

To give knowledge of salvation to his people, for the forgiveness of their sins,
through the tender mercy of our God, from whom the sunrise has shone upon us.
To give light to those who sit in darkness, and in the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

As an alternative to the Benedictus, Psalm 100 may be said, except on the 19th day of the month when it is appointed in the Lectionary.

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father, and will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

☆: O Lord, our heavenly Father, almighty and everlasting God, who has safely brought us to the beginning of this day: Defend us with your mighty power; and grant that this day we will not fall into any sin, or run into any kind of danger; but that we will obey you in all we do, to do always what is righteous in your sight, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Note:
